James has renewed his season ticket and still sits in his dads seat with his Mum Beverley, making memories. He has also convinced his mum that he



should attend as many away games as possible and is in fact joining in many community things where his confidence has grown tremendously.

Beverly his mum is extremely proud of James that he has found a way through the hurdles that have been in his way. She can't put into words how Chris and the team have made such a difference to James also , just by stopping and speaking to him and shaking his hand at away matches, they would have no idea what they are doing for James and probably many others. A picture at Wealdstone of Chris shaking James hand got him on twitter which made his day.

All these positive things are making James smile again and that is priceless, it's all therapy. Farming and football are in James blood and now he is allowed to follow those dreams.



U10's latest.

Under the guidance of Team Manager, Matt Percival, Yeovil Town's U18 got the season underway with their opening South West Counties Youth League game against Cirencester Town at Alvington.

Several returning second-year players have been joined by an exciting new crop of youngsters keen to make their mark as part of the Elite Player Development Programme (EPDP), a joint venture between Yeovil Town FC and Yeovil College. The Young Glovers set up with a 3-5-2 formation, mirroring the set-up within the first team, and afforded league debuts to Harrison Foster, Alex Stevens and Ethan O'Sullivan.

The game began in cagey fashion, with both teams sizing up the opposition during the opening exchanges. The home side nearly struck first when a knockdown from Stevens, following a corner, fell invitingly for Max Dyer who saw his close range shot expertly blocked by the keeper. Cirencester responded with a shot from distance firing just over, but Yeovil began to see an upturn in possession and threatened further through half chances from Foster and Stevens. Somewhat against the run of play, Cirencester scored the opener in the 20th minute, with a header direct from a corner. 0-1.



The Young Glovers were quick off the blocks to start the second half and Stevens and Bateson both went close before the mercurial Benjani Jr grabbed an equaliser on 50 minutes when he muscled past the defender before clipping a shot past the onrushing keeper, 1-1.

The good early spell was quickly undone when the ball broke down the Cirencester left on 55 minutes and home keeper Rob Hollard had a rush of blood but failed to intercept the ball on the edge of his box. The advancing striker was able to whip the ball across for an easy tap-in to make it 1-2.

The home side once again were keen to make amends and a great move through the middle involving Graziano released Dyer who slammed the ball home, only to see his effort harshly ruled out for offside. However, Yeovil were soon able to level the score when Bateson slotted a well-placed finish into the bottom corner to make it 2-2 on 70 minutes.

The Young Glovers continued to pile on the pressure and had further chances through Hunter and Bateson before the visitors, always a threat on the counter, got their third when a long ball up the middle was allowed to bounce and was clinically dispatched to make it 2-3 with less than 10 minutes left.

Percival sent on debutants Josh Haskett and Nathan Hart in search of an equaliser, but were indebted to, first, a fine block from Hollard and then goal-saving tackle from Dyer as they chased the game. With five minutes to go Yeovil got their third when a hooked shot from Graziano came back off the bar and Hart was on hand to head the ball home, 3-3. A frantic finale ensued with Benjani seeing his shot saved before Foster had a goal-bound effort dramatically cleared off the line by a defender as the final whistle sounded.

Credit the team for three times coming back from a goal down, but they'll be disappointed with the goals conceded.

When Yeovil fans first saw Morgan Williams as a teenager making his first National league start against Halifax Town in 2019, they knew they were watching a bright young player ready to make his mark.

Fast forward to 2022, although it's just his second full season in men's football, Williams is already looking like a seasoned professional in the Glovers' backline.

Having starred at wing back and centre back this season, Williams is always ready to help the team where he can.

"Being able to play in a few positions helps massively, when I spoke to the gaffer at the start of the season, we both knew that I could play those roles, whether it be right wing back, full back or centre back. It helps me personally as it means I can get on the pitch, but anywhere I can help the gaffer out, I am always happy to do so."

Chris Hargreaves is the second permanent manager Williams has played under at Huish Park, and he is enjoying life working under the new boss.

"It's been really good, not just with him, but Toddy (Chris Todd), and Marcus (Stewart). All three of them are great people and top coaches, they've really helped me already."

As someone who has had a longer association to the football club than most, Williams is a player eager to help off the pitch too, making sure his new teammates can settle into the area.

"I always want to be one of the boys that helps. We've had a few loanees come in especially and I've got to know them really well. They're all really good lads.

"We've had one away trip where we stayed the night, and did a few initiation songs with them, we're just waiting for the next away trip to do some more.

"Hopefully this season we can do something special as a group."

In Town's last four games, they have conceded just two goals, despite a few changes in personnel, Williams has been an ever present, influential figure in these fixtures.





"As a team, we pride ourselves in getting clean sheets, for a defender that's my job first and foremost. If the boys are scoring at the other end of the pitch, that's a bonus, but when things aren't quite falling our way it's our job to keep the goals out, and find a way to at least get a draw.

"For us now, it's a case of bringing everything together for a complete performance. As fans can see, we've had some games where we have put good performances in but not quite had the result. We now need to put both sides of it together, and when that happens, we can fly up the table."

This weekend is an opportunity for the Glovers to climb the table, but it will be no easy task against top of the league Chesterfield. Amongst the Spireites squad is former Glover Joe Quigley who made the move to Derbyshire in January.

"Joe's a good lad so it makes for a good battle against two competitive teams. It's a battle I am really looking forward to. We seem to have a knack of performing against the top 8, the Wrexham's, the Chesterfield's, the Notts County's etc. We know that going into every game, if we prepare properly, we can go out there and perform on the pitch."

The Brazilian was signed over the summer on a season-long loan from Port Vale. Covolan has played for a number of clubs including Torquay United, scoring for them in the 2021 National League play-off final.

LAURENCE MAGUIRE

A central defender, who has also played in a defensive midfield role, Maguire is a proud product of Chesterfield's academy.

BAILEY CLEMENTS

The young full-back spent 14 years at boyhood club lpswich Town before joining Chesterfield in the summer.

RHYEEM SHECKLEFORD

Sheckleford signed for the Spireites in the summer after leaving Maidenhead. He started his career with Fulham, playing for the under-18s, under-19s, under-21s and under-23s.

INE COOK

Cook was signed from Bognor Regis Town in the summer for an undisclosed fee. The central defender started off his career with a stint at Sheffield Wednesday.

BRANDEN HORTON

Horton joined the Spireites in the summer after making 20 appearances for Doncaster in League One last season. He spent five years with the South Yorkshire club.

IFFF KING

King, who features as a right-sided wing-back, joined Chesterfield after winning FC Halifax Town's Player of the Year award last season.

IAMIF GRIMES

The central defender joined Chesterfield last summer after helping Hereford reach the FA Trophy final at Wembley at the end of last season.

TYRONE WILLIAMS

Williams was signed from National League rivals Solihull Moors for an undisclosed fee last November

DARREN OLDAKER

Oldaker started his career in Queens Park Rangers' academy before spending four years with Gillingham. After leaving Priestfield, he had spells at Billericay Town and Westfield.

GEORGE COOPER

Cooper started his career with Crewe Alexandra, making his way through the academy and into the first team. He amassed close to 150 appearances before moving to Peterborough.

OLLIE BANKS

Banks rejoined Chesterfield in the summer after leaving Barrow. In his first spell at the club, he was instrumental in helping Chesterfield win the 2013/14 League Two title.

ARMANDO DOBRA

Dobra signed a two-year contract to join Chesterfield in the summer after leaving lpswich Town. The Albania Under-21 international had a season-long loan at Colchester United last term.

LIAM MANDEVILLE

Mandeville began his career at Doncaster Rovers, coming through the club's academy before breaking into the first team and making his debut in 2015.

JACK CLARKE

Clarke joined the Spireites on loan from Aston Villa in January 2021. The young midfielder started out with Villa's Under-9s and had a spell on loan at Yeovil Town before arriving at the Technique Stadium.

MANNY OYELEKE

Oyeleke joined the Spireites from Port Vale in April 2021 for an undisclosed fee. He was with Chelsea and Queen Park Rangers as a youngster.

CALVIN MILLER

Chesterfield secured 23-year-old Scot Miller's signature last summer, beating off competition from other clubs to sign him.

TOM WHELAN

Whelan rejoined the Spireites in February, signing from Eastleigh for an undisclosed fee after seven months away.

TIM AKINOLA

The young midfielder recently joined the Spireites on loan from Arsenal until the end of the season.

DANNY ROWE

After being with Manchester United as a youngster, Rowe played in non-league football, which included a prolific six-year spell with AFC Fylde.

AKWASI ASANTE

Born in Amsterdam, Akwasi moved to England to join Birmingham City, where he settled into the youth system before signing a professional contract with the club in 2011.



KABONGO TSHIMANGA

Tshimanga was signed for an undisclosed fee just before the start of the season, following a prolific spell at Boreham Wood.

JOE QUIGLEY

Quigley was signed from National League rivals Yeovil Town in January for an undisclosed fee. He began his career at Bournemouth and had a number of loan spells before joining Maidstone.

MICHAEL GYASI

Gyasi started his career with the academies at Northampton Town and Chelsea's before going to Leicester City as part of their youth set-up.

PAUL COOK - MANAGER

Paul Cook returned to the club for a second spell in February, seven years after leaving to take charge at Portsmouth. During his first stint with the Spireites, Cook guided the club to the League Two title and the League One play-offs.



Last time out.

Yeovil Town picked up a point on the road against Eastleigh in a very wet Silverlake Stadium.

Sam Pearson ignited the game with his early goal, but it was the hosts who really set the tempo throughout.

J.J. McKiernan's second half goal levelled the affair, and despite being reduced to ten late on, secured them a point which was ultimately a fair reflection of the game.

Chris Hargreaves opted for three changes to the Yeovil side which lost to York. AFC Bournemouth loanee Owen Bevan made his debut at centre back, whilst Matt Worthington returned from injury in the midfield. Pearson started on the wing in his first start after a back injury.

Having struggled to take their chances in previous fixtures, the Glovers were clinical at the first attempt on Tuesday night. Pearson netted his first goal for Town on seven minutes after Malachi Linton pounced on the ball and found the Bristol City loanee who produced an excellent finish.

The goal sparked the hosts into life, who mounted a vast amount of pressure on Grant Smith's goal.

It was former Glover Tristan Abrahams who looked most likely to score in the first half for Eastleigh, forcing saves from our no.1 on three occasions.

At the other end, Linton and Charlie Wakefield both had shooting chances for the Glovers, but neither did enough to test Joe McDonell in net for the Spitfires.





The second half saw Eastleigh up their intensity. With 67 minutes on the clock, Charlie Carter and John Oyenuga had shots that flew just over the bar as the Spitfires came ever closer to a leveller.

Less than ten minutes later, the hosts found the leveller through McKiernan, who drove through the Town defence and fired beyond Smith to set up a nervy finish.

Eastleigh maintained their pressure, causing a number of scrambles in the penalty area, but the Glovers defence stood firm, clearing their lines on a number of occasions.

Late in the day, former Weymouth man Brennan Camp was sent off for an over zealous challenge on D'Ath. With just a matter of moments to play, the sending off had little bearing on the result.


